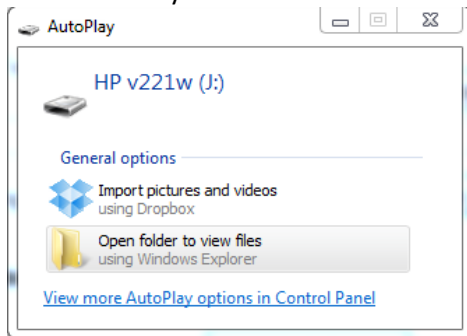
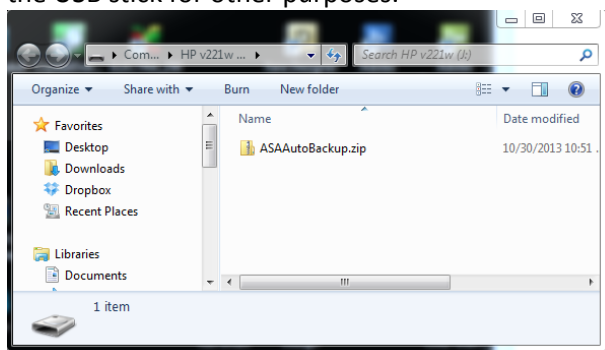


Copying ASA files manually from a backup USB stick.

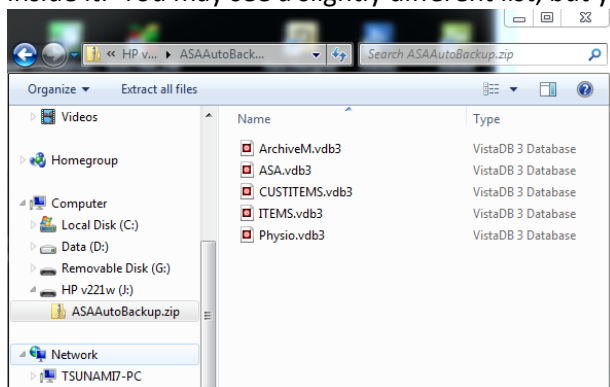
When you plug a USB stick into a Windows 7 or Windows 8 computer, a popup will appear asking what you want to do with it. On my Windows 7 machine it looks like this...



Select the 'Open folder to view files' option. Now you will see the backup file, and perhaps other files if you have used the USB stick for other purposes.



Double click the ASAAutoBackup.zip file. Windows will open the compressed zip file and display the individual files inside it. You may see a slightly different list, but you should at least see all these files.



Right click on the file(s) you want to copy and select Copy on popup menu. Now you can paste the file wherever you want. To put the file into another users ASA folder, follow the instructions below for the Operating System you use.

Windows XP – Go to Start and select 'Explorer.' Navigate to C:\Documents and Settings\All Users\Application Data\ASA. Select Paste from the Edit menu.

Windows 7 – Go to Start and select 'Computer.' Navigate to C:\Users\All Users\ASA . Select Paste from the Organize menu.

Windows 8 – Select the Computer icon at the lower left corner. Navigate to C:\Users\All Users\ASA . Select the Paste icon near the upper left corner of the Explorer.
